OCTOBER: Month of the Rosary

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The Rosary is appealing and simple. The purpose of the Rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Every time we pray the Our Father we are reminded that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. Praying the Hail Mary reminds us that we are joining with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. In addition, they help to make us aware that Mary was and is still intimately joined with her son, Jesus, in all the mysteries of earthly and heavenly existence. The constant repetition of prayer creates an atmosphere of contemplation.

Tips to Pray the Rosary Daily

- ✓ Carry a Rosary in your pocket.
- ✓ Say it while you wait (for example at a bus stop.)
- ✓ Recite the Rosary while doing chores or while you work out.
- ✓ Use images and music. The Rosary is a contemplative prayer.
- ✓ If you are upset, pray for the situation that worries you.
- ✓ Pray while you walk and think of the people in your life.
- ✓ Use each mystery to ask for a specific intention.
- ✓ If you can't pray the whole Rosary at once, break it into parts.
- ✓ Say it in moments of sadness or spiritual drought.
- ✓ Fall asleep praying the Rosary.

SPP KID'S CORNER

LEARN MORE ABOUT THE SAINTS

St. Thérèse of Lisieux - Feast Day October 1



St. Thérèse is most known for her "Little Way." She spoke not of doing great things, but of small things with great love. She saw herself as a child who lived in complete dependence on God. Therese acknowledged her littleness and believed this showed more clearly God's greatness. She once said, "If all the lowly flowers wished to be roses, nature would lose its springtime beauty." Thérèse saw herself as a tiny flower in the garden of God and believed His power shone more clearly through her weakness. She had a practice that helped her count her little deeds for God that is simple and perfect for children of all ages.

Thérèse had a string of beads, now known as Sacrifice Beads—or good deed beads. This is a simple string of beads with a medal on one end and a crucifix on the other. In between are ten beads. Children love carrying these in their pockets and often become very conscientious as they seek to make Jesus happy. Every time they make a sacrifice or do a good deed or say a kind word, they can pull a bead towards the cross. However, it is important for them to understand that St. Thérèse considered even picking up a small piece of string to be an act of love. It is not the greatness of what we do that matters, but the love with which we do them.

Saint Thérèse's feast day is October 1, but her message reaches all people at all times. God wants to meet us wherever we are and He is accessible to all who seek Him. The little way is a way of forgiveness, confidence, trust, and love. It is selfless and simple. St. Thérèse of Lisieux is a great saint who arrived at holiness by a simple path we all can follow. She is with us and will help us.

5 Ways to Nurture Your Child's FAITH

Parents are responsible for the material well-being of their children. Yet we know our children are spiritual beings as well. Here are five gifts you can give to nurture the spiritual life of your child.

1. Explain to your child why you gave him or her the name you did.

In the Bible, names carry a lot of meaning. Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter (Greek for "rock"), which indicated Peter's vocation as the leader of Christian community. By telling your child how you chose his or her name, you can highlight the spiritual hopes you have for your child and emphasize his or her connection to the larger community.

2. Tell stories about your ancestors.

Explain, for example, how their grandparents or great-great grandparents came to this country if they are of immigrant heritage. Such stories—of the strength, perseverance, and faith of their forebears—will help them know that they are part of a larger, grander story than just their own.

3. Share with your child who your favorite saint is and why.

Describe how you receive inspiration from the example or teaching of this saint (or saintly person, whether canonized or not). Explain to your child the reason you are devoted to this saint and talk about other people whom you admire.

4. Offer a story about how your faith helped you in a difficult time in your life.

Think back to a time when you made an important decision and, if you are comfortable, share how your faith shaped the decision. Set aside time to also talk about how your faith helps you on a daily basis.

5. Give your child your time and attention; listen to their hopes and dreams.

The care and concern you express for your child provides a foundation upon which your child can accept God's love and the love of others. Every day you help to shape the attitude your child brings to prayer and worship. The loving attention you share with your child prepares him or her to encounter Jesus in the heart, in the Eucharist, and in other people.

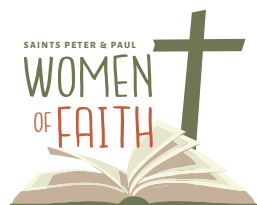
WOMEN OF FAITH

ALL SOULS DAY MEMORIAL CANDLES

As in the past years, the Parish will continue the opportunity of memorializing your loved ones by dedicating a real Candle in their name during the month of November. It remains a wonderful and fitting way to show tribute in prayer to our beloved deceased.

The Candles will be displayed again next to the Tabernacle and throughout the Sanctuary, depending on the number memorialized. The names that you memorialize will be inscribed on the Candles, in order that all can see and join in prayer for them.
