## ABOUT TWO SPECIAL PATRON SAINTS



### ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL THE PATRON SAINT OF POLICE OFFICERS

Among the saints, St Michael The Archangel is one of the most revered. Tough and dedicated the service of God and protection of those whom God cherishes, he is the patron saint for a number of causes and groups. In particular, he is the patron saint of police officers; those sworn to serve and protect. St. Michael is honored as the angel who fought for God against Satan in the battle described in the book of Revelation (20:1-3).

A Saint Michael necklace is often worn by polices officers or their spouse as a prayer for protection and safety. Michael the Archangel is perhaps the most popular patron saint of all, patron for over 50 causes and places.



### ST. FLORIAN THE PATRON SAINT OF FIREFIGHTERS

St. Florian-an officer in the Roman army who died protecting his faith-is without a doubt reaping his reward in heaven as promised by God. Put to death for refusing to kill Christians as ordered by Emperor Diocletian, St. Florian is the man who has been given the title of patron saint of firefighters and floods. There are several reasons why it's believed Saint Florian earned the title of patron saint of fire and firefighters: legend says that during his life, St. Florian put out a massive fire with only one

bucket of water, saving a village from ruin. St. Florian is often depicted in artwork pouring water from a bucket or small vessel. Many years after St. Florian's death, a man said he was saved from a deadly fire when he called on St. Florian, begging for his intercession.

What is  
LAETARE SUNDAY?

Sunday, March 30, is celebrated in the Church as Laetare Sunday, in which Catholics are urged to rejoice amid the penitential sacrifices of Lent.

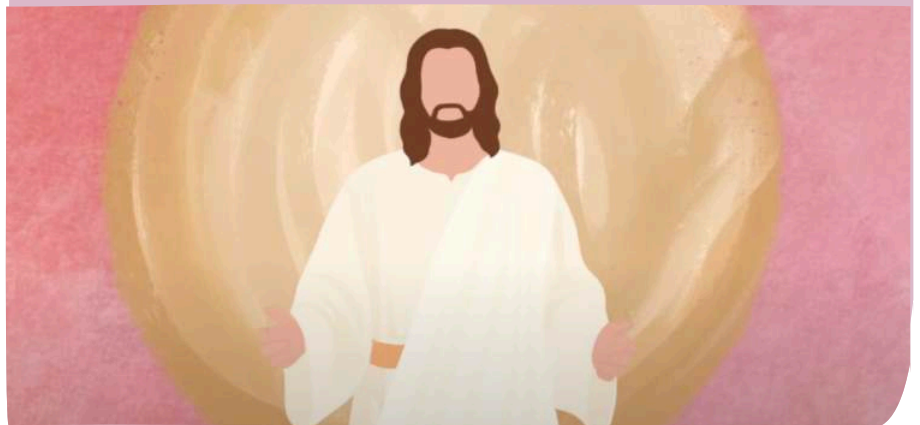
Laetare is the first word - meaning "rejoice" - in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink - or, more fittingly, rose - this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

The joy of Easter being around the corner is symbolized in a few other interesting liturgical possibilities. During Lent, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal forbids flowers adorning the altar. But on Laetare Sunday (as well as solemnities and feasts within the season), there's a temporary halt to these penitential observations!

At one time, marriages were generally forbidden during Lent, but Laetare Sunday was often associated as a day when marriages could be celebrated during the penitential season. While marriages are now only forbidden on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, Laetare Sunday is still a fitting day for those wishing to be married before Eastertide.

**Laetare Sunday comes 21 days before Easter, at the mid-point of**

**Lent.** And the custom of celebrating the Sunday as a moment to rejoice mid-Lent dates back to the early Church. It probably began as a celebration of catechumens, who were preparing to be baptized and enter the Church at Easter. Today, the Church rejoices that promise of Christ's resurrection is drawing near, and will be celebrated in full on Easter, which Catholics anticipate as Lent continues.



Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday - the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy! Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. There is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent - not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.

# 6 tips to Get You Through a Mid-Lent Slump

How is your Lent going?! Great, or not so great? Feeling like it is a long way to Holy Week? If your Lent has stalled- did you start with plans that were too much? Or did you begin with no idea how to begin? Either extreme means things might have fizzled out half way through. But fear not! Here are our 6 tips to help you reengage with Lent.

## 1. PRACTICE GRATITUDE IN THE MOMENT

Whenever I want to start over, I always think: "I'll start over later, tomorrow, when I've got time to sit down and take stock and begin again." Inevitably, that moment never happens, because I don't make it happen. I don't start over in the heat of the battle. So the battle never ends. If you feel like you're drifting through Lent, don't wait for the perfect time to restart. It won't happen- there isn't a perfect time. So wherever you are, stop, give yourself a few spare minutes, and thank God for, say, ten things about your day or your life right now. Gratitude helps turn our hearts back to God when we don't know where to begin.

## 2. ASK YOURSELF WHAT YOU HAVE LEARNED SO FAR

When the road ahead looks long, it's easy to forget how far we've already come. So ask yourself, what have you learned so far this Lent? If the answer is 'nothing': ask yourself again! It doesn't have to be anything specifically Lent related. Maybe God has been working in your life in a way you didn't realize. Maybe there is something nagging you in the back of your mind that He wants you to look at. Or maybe you learned something through what you have given up or taken up that has surprised you. Remind yourself why you started and rejoice in what you have learned so far!

## 3. ENTER THE DESERT: GIVE YOURSELF A RETREAT

Not everyone is going to have the luxury of being able to go away on a retreat between now and Easter. But is there a day, half day, or even just an evening between now and then that you could turn into a mini retreat for yourself? If you have a busy family life, this may not be possible- or you might wish to include them in your plans too. Ideas could include: a special visit to Adoration, making time for Confession, going on a walk (without your headphones on) journaling, art, reading the Sunday gospel, spending some time in silence, and of course, prayer. Put all the distractions (TV, radio, internet, phone, music etc) away for a set period of time and enter into some quality time with God.

## 4. HAVE A MOVIE NIGHT

I know this may not be the most conventional way to re-engage with Lent, especially when it is so good to have some time away from the distractions of technology- but there are some plus sides too! Watching something- whether it's a movie about the Easter story (Jesus of Nazareth or The Passion of Christ for example)- or online talks or

retreats (Fr Robert Barron has excellent resources on [wordonfire.org](http://wordonfire.org)) these can be a powerful way to leave the lethargy behind. Whatever you watch, watch it actively, not passively, engage with the material, make notes if necessary and always follow it up with prayer time. If you're watching a movie on the Crucifixion of Christ, it's always good to reread the Gospel stories too. Movies can be a powerful way to imagine and feel exactly what it was like in the moment, but nothing is as powerful as simplicity of the words of the Gospel.

## 5. IF YOU DIDN'T START LENT WITH A PLAN, MAKE ONE NOW

Lent isn't meant to be a competition of who can give up the most, or be the most holy. It is meant to be a time of renewal, of clearing out the junk in our lives and letting Springtime enter our hearts. But let us also not forget that it is a time of friendship, of walking with Christ through His time in the desert. So when I say, 'make a plan' I don't mean, sit down and work out how you can cram in everything in the next few weeks. Instead, ask yourself, "how can I plan my day so that there is a way that I can best grow in time spent with Christ?". Are there distractions that you can cut down on? Is there an empty space in your day that you could spend it prayer? Could you put down your phone and engage in conversations more?

## 6. FINALLY, JUST WALK QUIETLY AND HUMBLY WITH YOUR GOD

As we get ever nearer to Holy Week, remember God wants us as much as we want Him. As good and wonderful all the extra things we may be doing or giving up for Lent are, remember to get to the heart of what this is. Read the Gospel passages of Christ's return to Jerusalem, the Last Supper and the Way of the Cross. The words of Pope Francis in *Evangelii Gaudium* are beautiful here:

'Now is the time to say to Jesus: "Lord, I have let myself be deceived; in a thousand ways I have shunned your love, yet here I am once more, to renew my covenant with you. I need you. Save me once again, Lord, take me once more into your redeeming embrace". How good it feels to come back to him whenever we are lost!'

Come into Christ's embrace, and grow in His love, so that together, we can walk through the events of Holy Week with Him, and rejoice with Him on the other side!

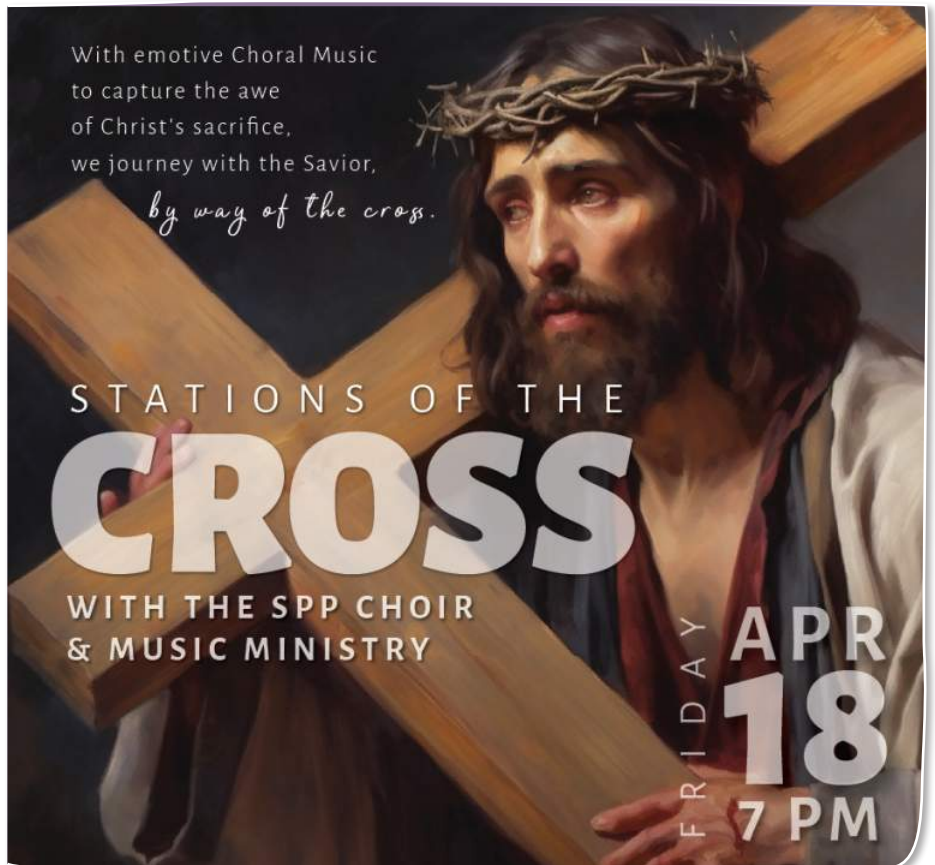
